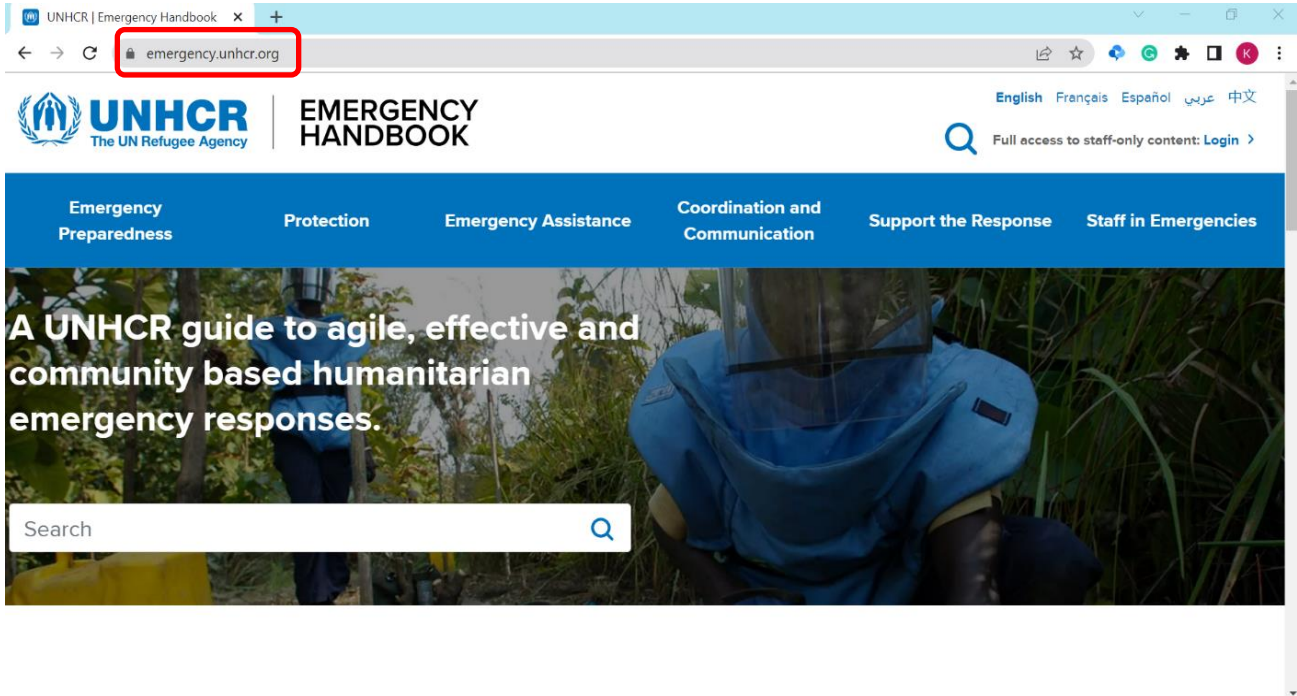


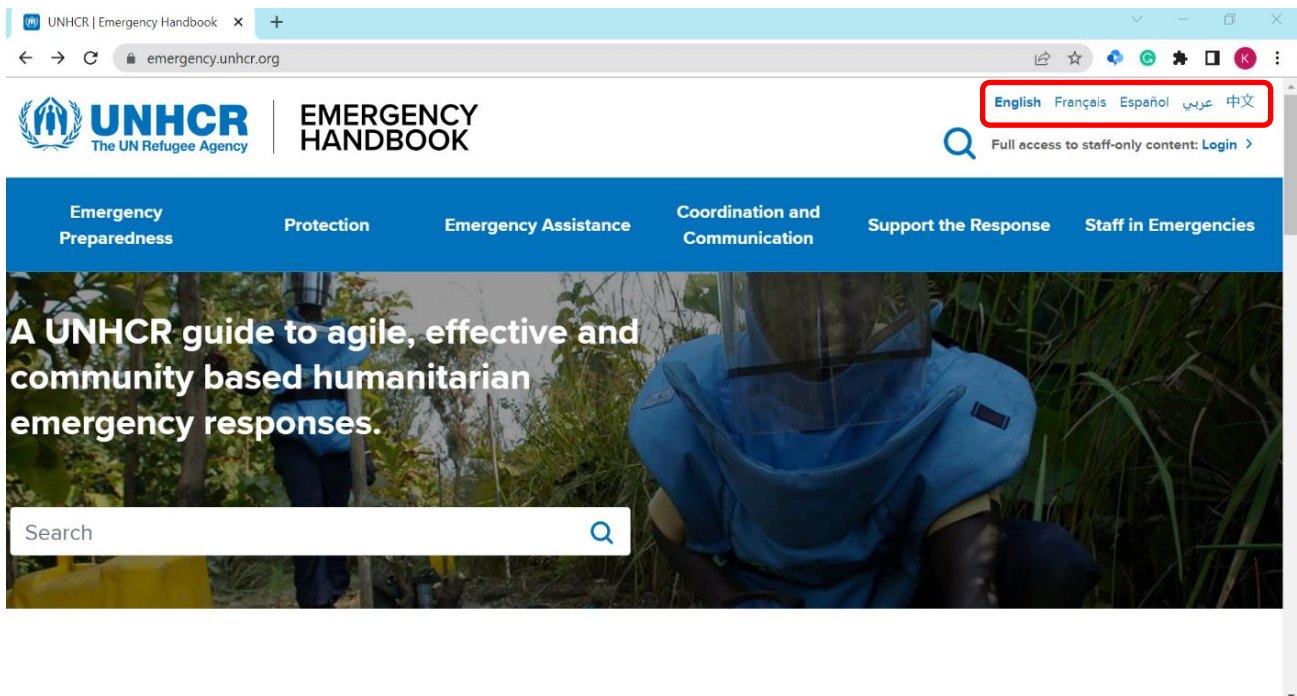

Welcome to the **Emergency Handbook!**

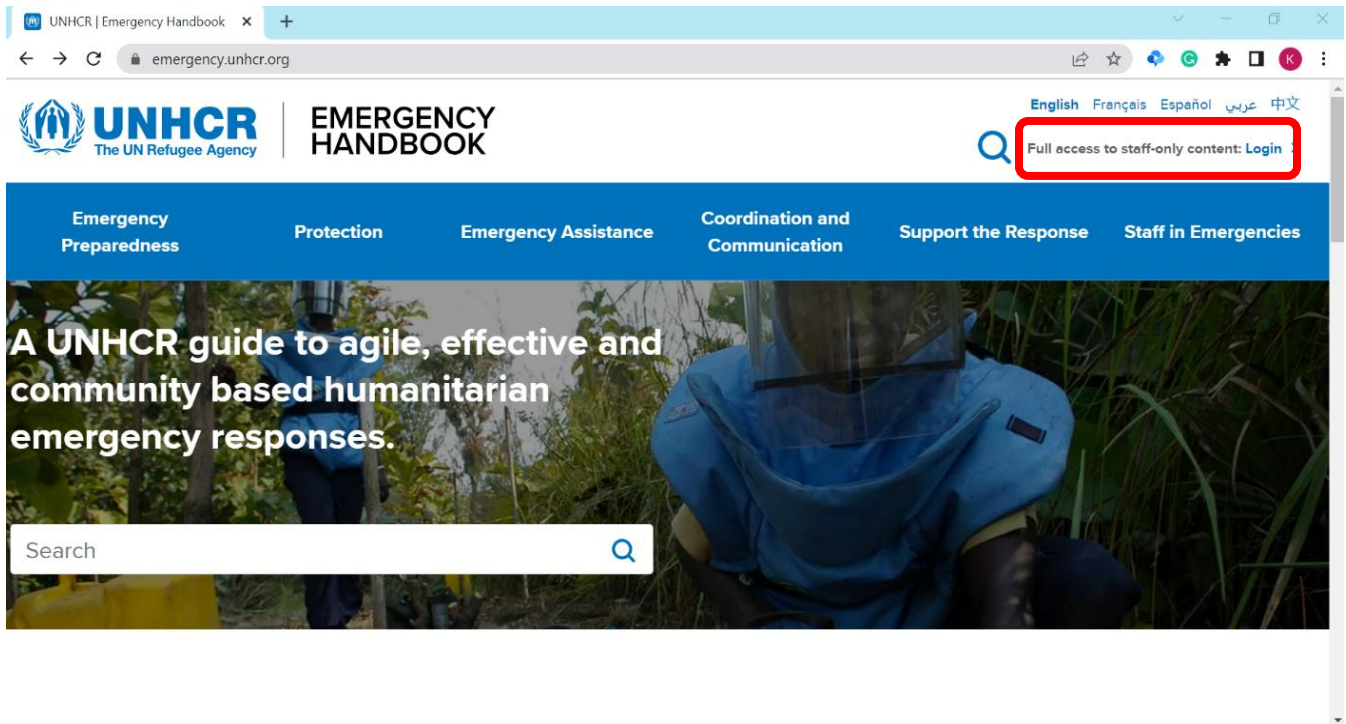
Please, type emergency.unhcr.org in your browser to access the online UNHCR Emergency Handbook (EHB).



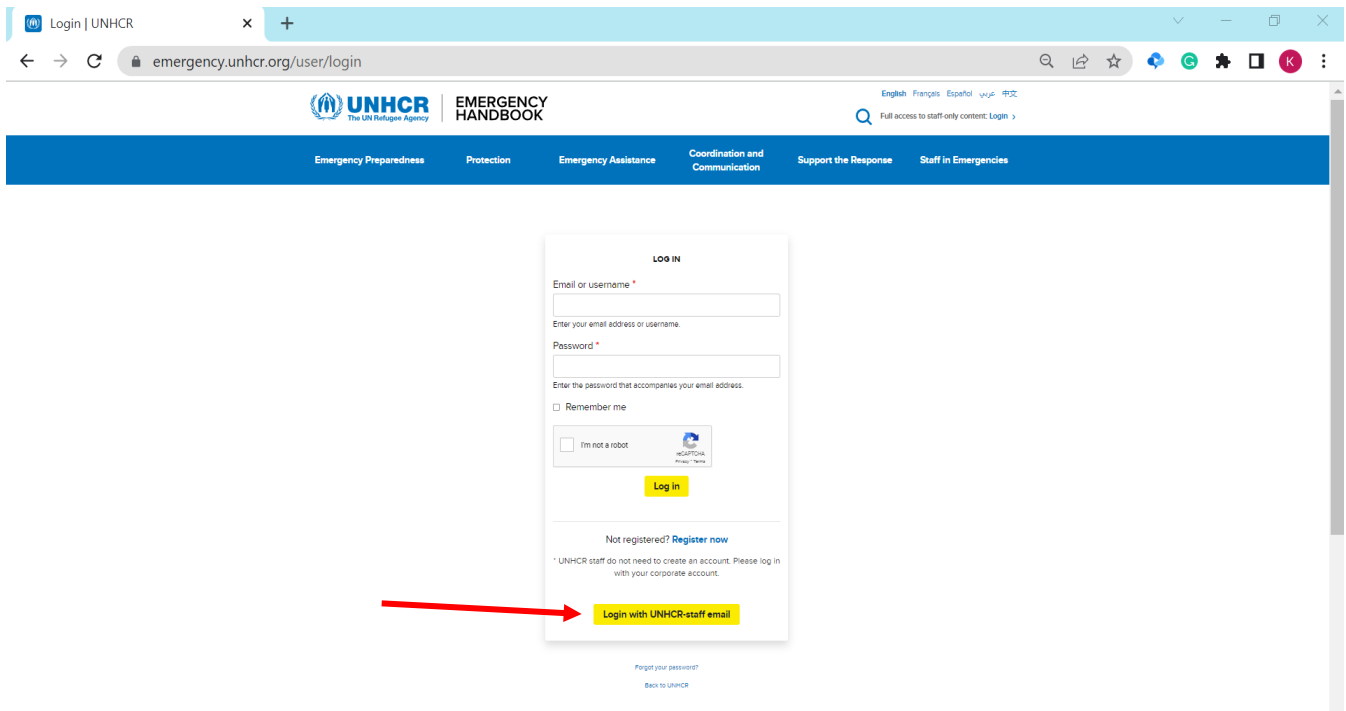
The EHB is available in **5 languages**, and you can select your language in the top right corner.



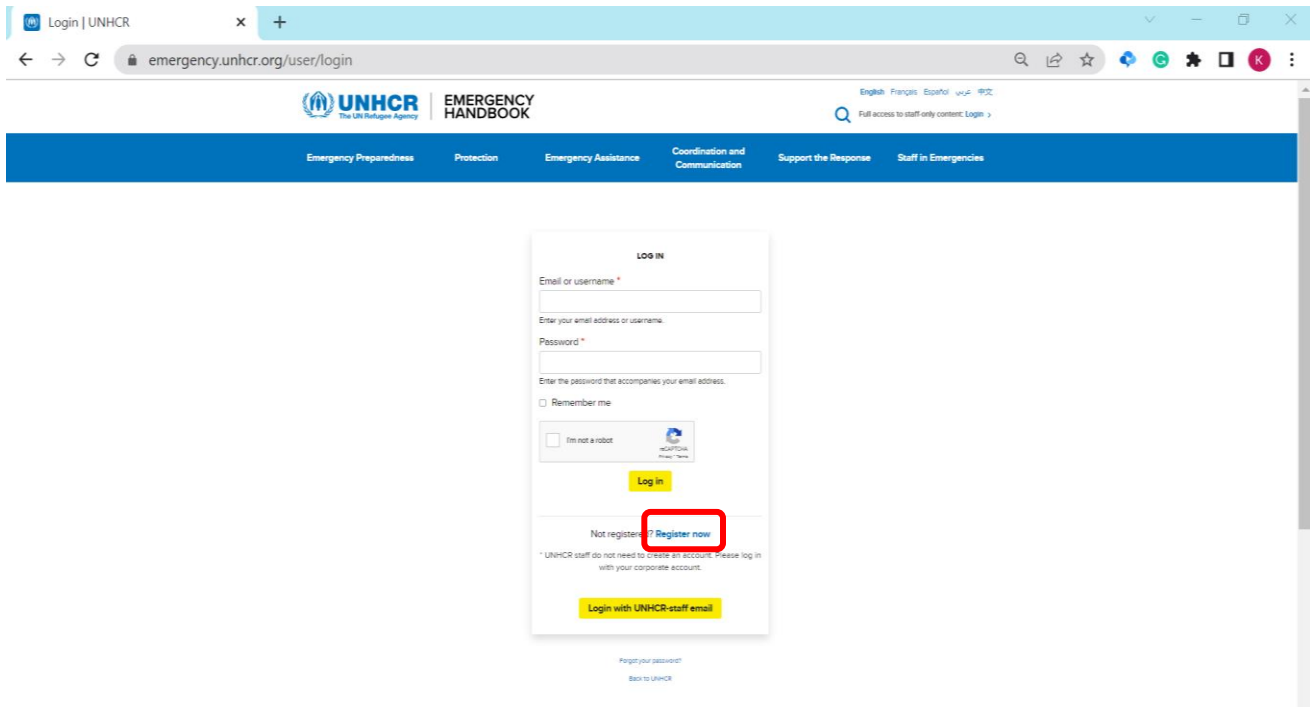
The EHB has **two types of content**: Entries accessible to the public and UNHCR staff and entries restricted to UNHCR staff **only**. By logging in with your UNHCR credentials, you will be able to access the full content of the EHB.



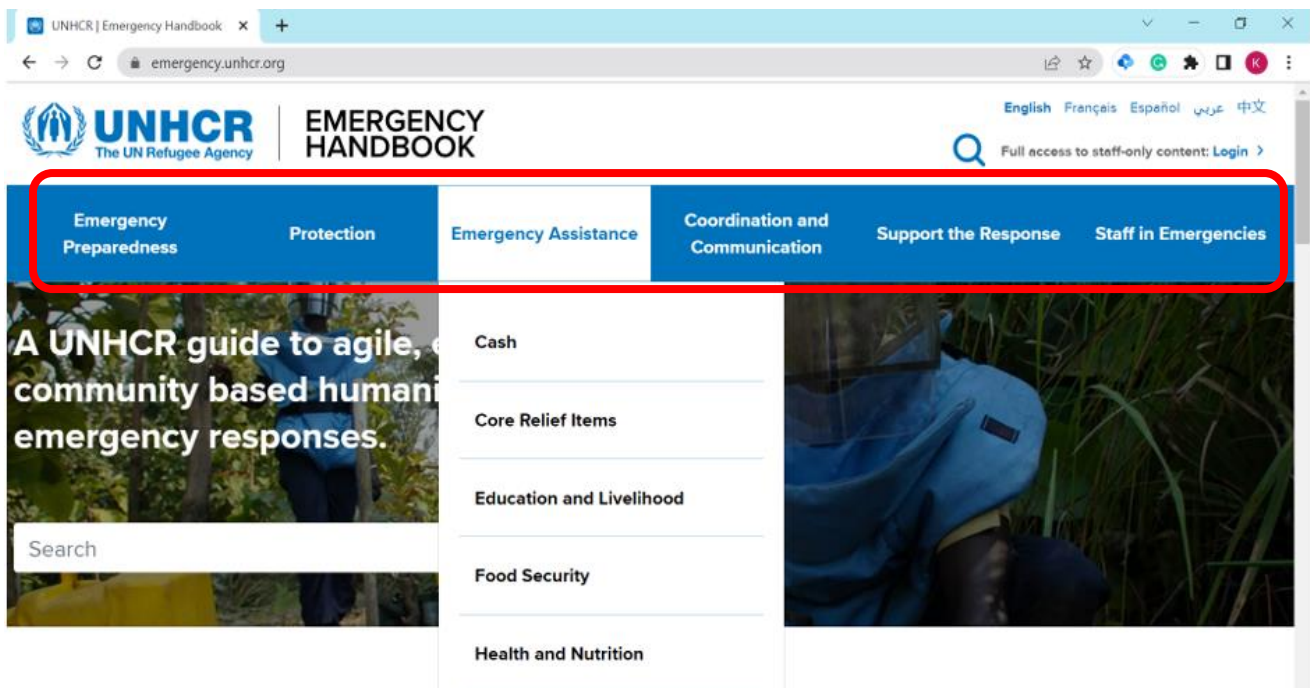
If you are a UNHCR staff, please **log in** with your **UNHCR credentials** (email and password) using the second login option on the bottom. There is no need to register first.



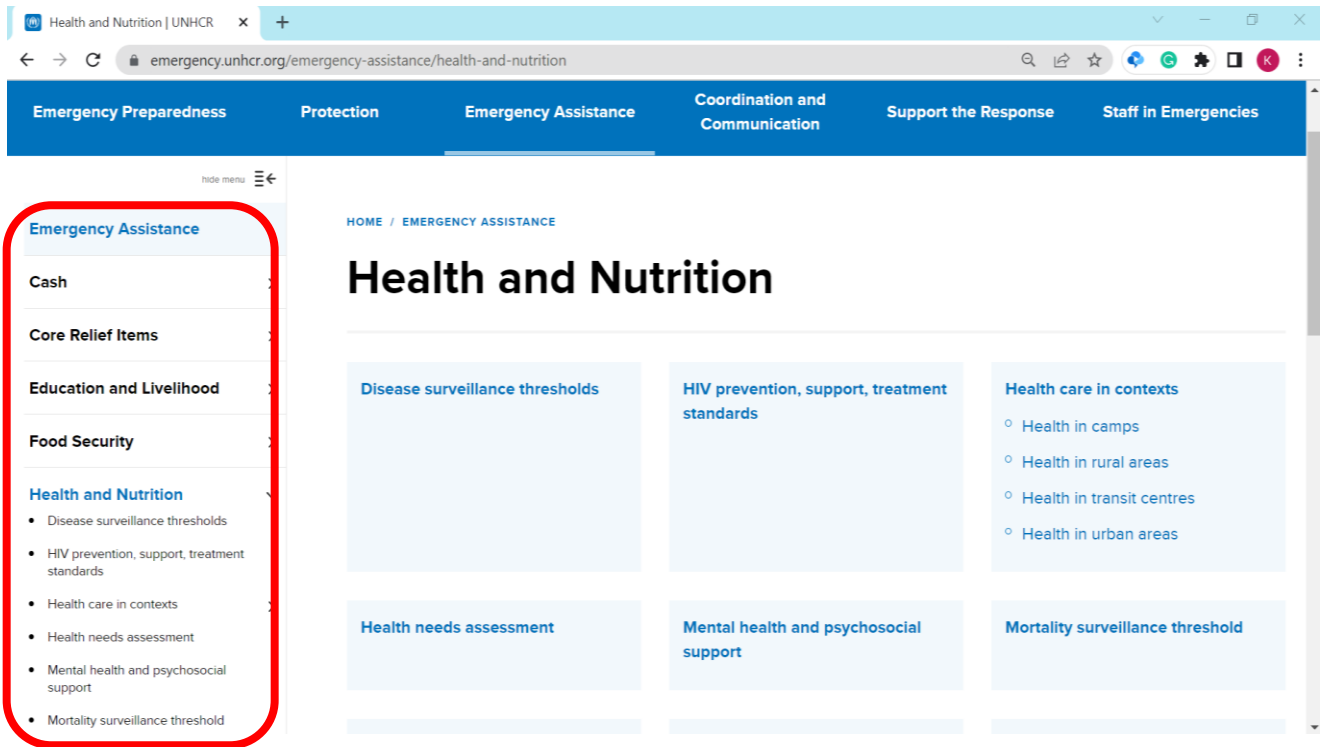
If you are an **external user**, please **register** first, then you will be able to enter your email address and password to log in.



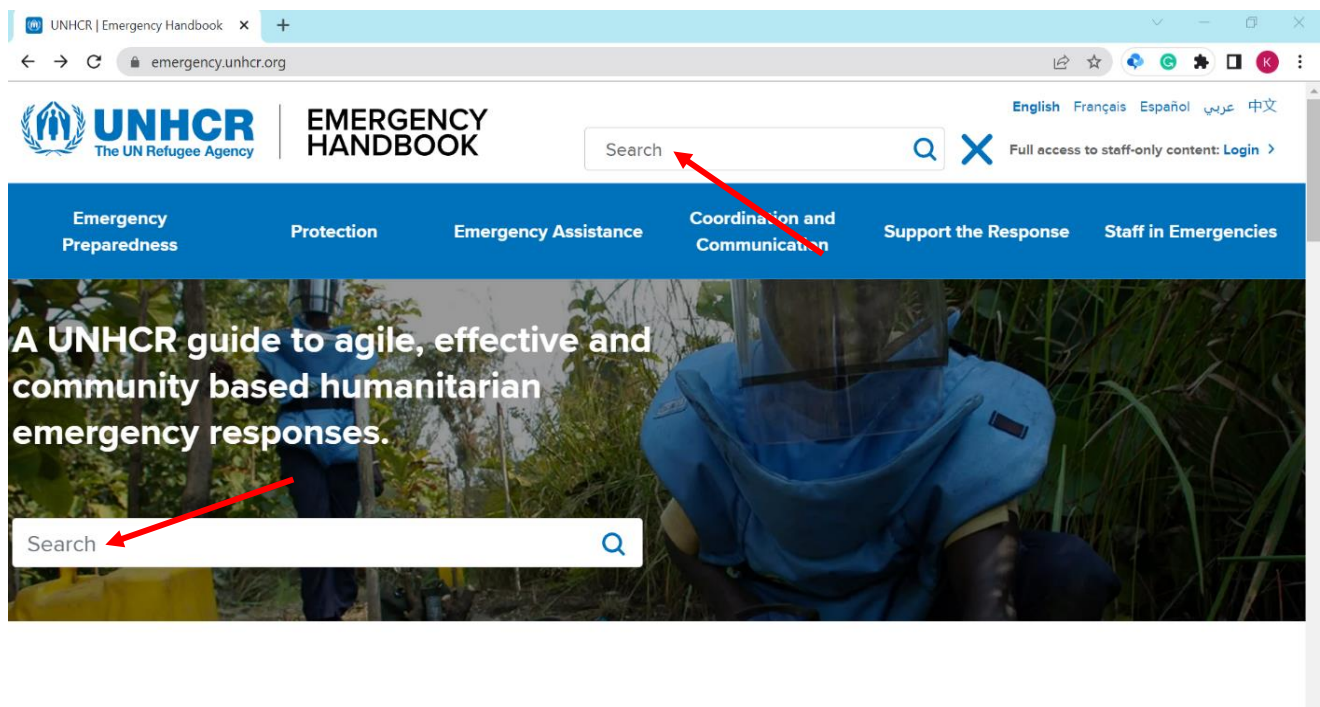
You can easily navigate between the major topics by hovering over the main headings displayed in the blue ribbon on top of each page. The EHB is structured in **6 main topics**. Under each main topic you find sections which host the entries.



You can also use the menu on the **side bar** to navigate and expand any of the categories, to view the sections and entries. Here, we have expanded the **Health and Nutrition** category as an example.



To search for an entry or topic on the home page you can use either of the **Search** fields below. Regardless of whether you are in a section or on an entry page, the **Search** field is always available on the top.

Key points

- Refugee emergency preparedness should always be undertaken in partnership with the host government, UN, NGOs, and other relevant partners.
- UNHCR and the host government co-lead refugee emergency preparedness.
- The PPRE approach requires the implementation of minimal preparedness, including emergency risk analysis, wherever UNHCR is present. Heightened risk of an emergency triggers the implementation of advanced preparedness measures, some of which are context specific.

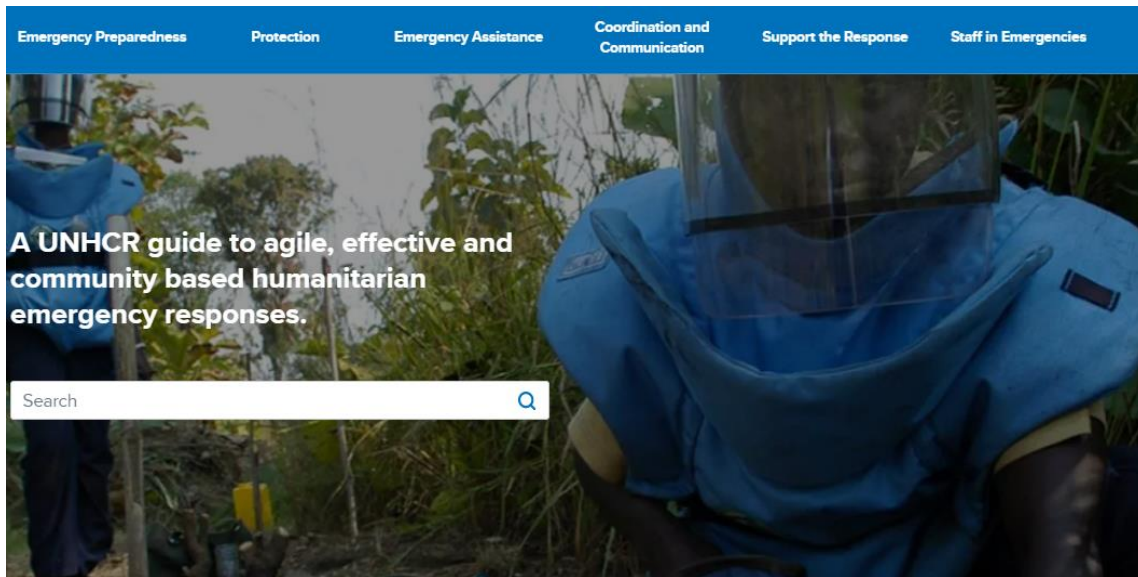
